

Catch-up funding (recovery premium and school-led tutoring) – planned expenditure 2021-22

Amount of funding:

School-led tutoring **£2430**

Recovery funding **£2900**

Rationale:

Following the 2020 and 2021 lockdowns due to the COVID-19 pandemic, schools have received additional money to provide support for those pupils that require it. At **Kirklington Primary School**, in order to utilise this additional funding in the best possible way, we have considered carefully the research and advice put forward by the EEF and used observations and assessments of children’s academic and personal development needs to inform our decisions. The table below outlines our intentional spend with a rationale accompanying each decision.

One to one and small group tuition	‘There is extensive evidence supporting the impact of high-quality 1:1 and small group tuition as a catch-up strategy.’	Additional qualified teacher support in KS2, x 3 afternoons per week (7.5 hours) for 21 weeks to follow a school-led tutoring programme, in liaison with the class teachers to enable pupils who are not making the expected progress. This will include a minimum of 65% of the pupils in the group eligible for pupil premium. Three sets of pupils will access 3 x 45mins sessions per week for 7 weeks (15.75hrs per child) in 1:1, 1:2 or 1:3 groups.	School led tutoring 7.7hrs pw x 21 weeks (grant plus subsidy from recovery premium)	Pupils at risk of not making expected progress from starting points or reaching ARE by the end of 21-22 are supported to catch up. Pupils transitioning to Y7 are supported to be ready to meet requirements of Y7 curriculum. <i>100% of pupils on programme make expected progress from starting points (DoL) or reach ARE by end of year in maths and/or reading.</i>
Intervention programmes	‘In order to support pupils who have fallen the behind furthest, structured interventions, which may also be delivered one to one or in small groups, are likely to be necessary’.
